The objects and purposes of the Club shall be:

- The aim of SALUT is to advocate for the replacement of the capitalist system with one in which the fundamental elements of the economy are socially owned and controlled and democratic systems of popular power established. Only these radical measures will enable us to deal with the economic, ecological and social crises of the 21st century
- SALUT aims to campaign, and protest in co-operation with all workers, First Nations, environmental, anti-racist, and other social movements, and to propose an alternative to the corporate control of society. A sustained mass campaign of total opposition to capitalism should aim to create the conditions to bring about a transformation to a socialist society that is based on co-operation, democracy and ecological sustainability.
- SALUT aims to support working-class struggle and other adjacent social movements
- SALUT will campaign for students' rights, including, a stronger voice for students and University staff in University affairs.

The TUSA State Council move to accept affiliation of SALUT, reflecting the rights of student to protest. However, the TUSA would like to assert that student societies' political views are not reflective of the TUSA, and that the TUSA expect all societies to abide by policy and procedure of both the TUSA and UTAS in political affiliation and action.

6.2 NUS Affiliation Passed via Circular Motion 02/08/23

MOTION: NUS Affiliation

Following the passing of the motion back in May for the State Council to negotiate in good faith with the NUS for reaccreditation, we have since come to an agreement of an affiliation fee of \$5000 (below the motion limit set at \$6000).

During this time, we have also seen the publishing of the Accords Interim Report which has called for a National Student Safety Charter, a re-evaluation of SSAF and how much goes to student unions, a reflection on student placement and work-integrated learning, and a call for the re-evaluation for student welfare and support. All of which, could be largely attributed to the NUS' own submission and the submission of their member associations. We have also seen a Federal Senate Inquiry into Universities Australia, and particularly their handling of student safety on campus that has seen NUS partnering with End Rape on Campus to reignite calls for a Federal Student Safety Taskforce to truly address the issues at hand that were revealed by the 2021 NSSS results. Reaccreditation with the NUS will allow TUSA State Council to have a louder voice in the national forums of which so many of the issues we seek to address must be fixed at the root cause of the problems, be that student welfare, student safety on campus, or student placements, to name a few. Additionally, annual reaccreditation allows for State Council each year to
