	 As a more recent member of the Tasmanian 	
	community I find some difficulty in connecting with	
	the land that I have so recently called my home.	
	However, coming from a small aboriginal community	
	in the Far North of Queensland, home of the Kuku	
	Yalanji people, I identify a strong connection with the	
	land of which I was raised and that shaped me. As I	
	return home, I am often reminded of a local dreamtime	
	story relating to Mt Demi, the peak that towers over	
	my small town. In the story, Mt Demi represents	
	'Kubirri' a protector of the Kuku Yalanji people from	
	evil spirts keeping them at bay and allowing the	
	people to care for the land and call it home. This story	
	instils me with a deep connection to the land of which	
	I was raised and represents to me the unwavering	
	safety and comfort of home. We pay our respects to	
	elders past and present, to the many Aboriginal	
	people that did not make elder status, and to the	
	Tasmanian Aboriginal community that continue to	
	care for Country. We recognise a history of truth	
	which acknowledges the impacts of invasion and	



colonisation upon Aboriginal people resulting in the genocide and forcible removal from their lands. We stand for a future that profoundly respects and acknowledges Aboriginal perspectives, culture, language, and history; and a continued effort to fight for Aboriginal justice and rights paving the way for a strong future. 1.2 ACKNOWLEDGEMENT OF LIVED EXPERIENCE L McLaren We would also like to acknowledge that everyone in this meeting today, has their own personal lived experience they bring to discussion. 4. INTERNAL UPDATES

4.1 Advocates Update

J Lenthall, K Davey, S Nolan

- We pulled together our 6 month data, and shared with SAFCU and counselling team.
- Bulk of the last six months was financial concerns and academic integrity cases. Mixed international and domestic.
 Primarily undergraduate students. Mixed location presentations. CoHM and COSE students making up the majority of cases.
- Previously identified some issues with advocates not being referred by other teams e.g. on academic integrity letters, now back on the majority of letters and referred by many staffs.
- Noted medical students had low awareness of the advocacy services, especially clinical years.
- R Stanaway noted AMC previously had in-school counsellors who may have taken some of the role of advocates.

4.2 TEL MONTHLY REPORT

S Maddock

- COSE and COBE tracking well. A Slamen working with advocates to identify any issues that can be resolved.
- CoHM work ongoing looking at impact of student advocates, consideration of making posters. Met with Fiona Cocker (Medicine Head of Wellbeing), consideration of how to engage TUMSS and students more meaningfully to ensure they have the right information (e.g. student advocacy services), and organising session with TUMSS and Fiona to visit the food hub and TUSA services.
- Discussed the importance of reaching out to and empowering student societies.
