	<ul> <li>Kanamaluka is the traditional name of the Tamar River</li> </ul>		
	in the palawa kani language. This is why Kanamaluka is		
	one of the suggested ideas for the name change of the		
	Batman Bridge.		
	<ul> <li>The naming of this bridge after John Batman in the</li> </ul>		
	1960s has recently been the subject of debate as more		
	light is shone on the land's history.		
	<ul> <li>John Batman, renowned for his humanitarian efforts</li> </ul>		
	with aboriginal people, would likely be better described		
	as a profit driven businessman. Few incidents of		
	violence related to aboriginal people were reported in		
	the North, likely because Launceston did not have its		
	own newspaper until 1829.		
	<ul> <li>This lack of resources meant that knowledge of many</li> </ul>		
	encounters and casualties were lost to all but those		
	involved. Anything that was reported was biased,		
	failing to include details of the atrocities aboriginal		
	people faced by white colonisers.		
	<ul> <li>If we take this into consideration, then the small</li> </ul>		
	amount of information we have on Batman's early		
	treatment of aboriginals would likely be even worse.		



This all highlights the importance of connecting and	
collaborating with the aboriginal people of the land	
where we reside, especially when there are still so	
many dark secrets hidden in the land's history.	
<ul> <li>With this in mind, I pay my respects and offer</li> </ul>	
recognition to the aboriginal community, the traditional	
owners and custodians of the land I currently reside on,	
and those that I may encounter in future travels.
