## Narrative update:

It has clearly been a very busy time for State Council Members. Thank you to all TUSA staff, representatives and volunteers for their hard work and support during this time.

Since our last State Council Meeting on Wednesday the 7<sup>th</sup> of February, I have begun keeping a rough track of my hours working for TUSA. As of the evening of Thursday the 19<sup>th</sup> of February, I have spent roughly 70 hours on TUSA related events, meetings, and communications over the last 3.2 weeks. This averages out to 21.8 hours per week, while my contract is for 12 hours per week (8 for Southern Campus President and 4 for Deputy President). I am comfortable with these statistics though, as they are evidently skewed by orientation and Clubs and Societies Days.
