L McLaren noted that the term of the current student member of University Council will end shortly, providing an opportunity for review of this matter. **APPENDIX F**



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	The Chair advised that University Council would consider the request proposed by TUSA, alongside the Legilative Council and the Universities Accord recommendations and other considerations including University Council succession planning. The Chair thanked the TUSA for this item.	
	5.6 TUSA Financial Sustainability The Members accepted the paper as read.	APPENDIX G
	The Chair noted the timeliness of a discussion of financial sustainability and understood TUSA was engaging in discussions with University executives on these matters as well.	
	The Chair highlighted the positive direction resulting from the Federal Government's 2024/25 budget announcement that from 1 January 2025, subject to the passage of legislation, higher education providers will be required to allocate a minimum of 40% of SSAF revenue to student-led organisations. It was noted that the announcement creates certainty and clear timeframes, and that the University and TUSA will need to work together towards the implementation of this requirement. The Chair noted that the paper's recommendation of an overall framework and set of principles around the use of SSAF and what provisions of services the TUSA should provide would be beneficial.	
	ACTION ITEM: A Watkins will undertake to ensure that the Vice Chancellor is apprised of the matters raised within the TUSA Financial Sustainability papers, and ensure that the University and TUSA work collaboratively towards implementation the SSAF legislative requirements.
