NARRATIVE UPDATE

TUSA Equity President Report – February 2025

As we gear up for another exciting academic year, I wanted to share what I've been working on as your TUSA Equity President over the past few weeks and give you a glimpse of what's ahead.

Recent Activities

January and February have been incredibly busy, filled with opportunities to connect, learn, and advocate on behalf of students. Some highlights include:

• Invasion Day March and Rally (26 January): I attended the march in Hobart, standing in solidarity with First Nations communities to reflect on the ongoing impact of colonization and the importance of truth-telling and reconciliation.





- TUSA State Council Meetings (23 January & 13 February): As part of my role, I've been attending these meetings to ensure equity remains at the forefront of TUSA's priorities.
- Engaging with Equity Officers and Collectives (29 January): I held catch-ups with our Equity Officers, discussed the AGM planning for the Disability Students Collective (DiSCo), and attended DISC training, strengthening our collective advocacy efforts.
- **Pride Parade (1 February):** I proudly joined the Pride Parade in Hobart, celebrating our LGBTQIA+ community and reaffirming TUSA's commitment to inclusivity.
- National Union of Students (NUS) Presidents Summit (5–7 February): Representing TUSA as a
 proxy, I had the chance to meet with student union leaders from across Australia. It was a fantastic
 opportunity to exchange ideas and learn from their successes. Notably, our TUSA Food Hub
 program gained significant interest, with RMIT inspired to adopt a similar initiative to tackle food
 insecurity among students.
- **Disability Advocacy and Inclusion:** I participated in the UTAS Disability Inclusion Campus Reference Group (11 February), continuing our push for a more inclusive campus, and worked on planning an AGM for DiSCo with L Maloney.
