Highlights from the Past Month

This month has been a busy and rewarding period for myself and the Equity Committee, with a strong focus on student engagement and equity-driven advocacy.

Orientation Week & Clubs and Societies Day

The highlight of the month was undoubtedly Orientation Week, where we welcomed both new and returning students. The Sandy Bay Clubs and Societies Day, alongside the Student Life Expo, were fantastic opportunities to connect with students, promote TUSA Equity initiatives, and help create a more inclusive campus culture.





Events from the Women's Officer

The Women's Officer hosted a successful Cancer Council Morning Tea, bringing students together to support an important cause. As part of International Women's Day, the Yarn Bombing of the Millennial Monument on Sandy Bay campus was a powerful visual statement. This initiative also raised awareness around period poverty and promoted key support services such as TUSA's free sanitary items program and the 101 Hearts initiative addressing gender-based violence.

Neurodiversity Week Awareness

We proudly celebrated Neurodiversity Week with an information stall, recognising that neurodiverse students make up a significant proportion of those accessing learning support services at UTAS. I also advocated for the university's upcoming Disability Inclusion Action Plan (DIAP) to have a specific focus on the needs and experiences of neurodiverse students.
