As the year has properly started, many committees have met in the past month. I attended the University Course and Unit Proposals Committee, the Gender-Based Violence Oversight Committee, and Academic Senate. Within Academic Senate, the main topics of discussion regarded the reduction of the number of the teaching periods, a new credit framework to more easily credit prior learning, and a shift of the enrolment dates from October to mid-November such that this can hopefully coincide with timetabling. I was also able to attend a meeting regarding the Academic System Reform (which include the teaching period reductions) led by L Bereznicki as part of a student reference group, something I am very curious to see where it leads. I look forward to the future discussions and learn more about what this will mean for students.
