From the TUSA Equity President

Over the past month, I have been actively representing your voices, collaborating with university and external stakeholders, and pushing forward important conversations around inclusion, accessibility, and support for students from all backgrounds.

Here's a quick snapshot of what I along with the TUSA Equity officers been working on:

Advocating for Access & Equity

I started the month by contributing to an accessibility planning session with the TUSA Clubs & Societies team, ensuring student events and spaces are genuinely inclusive. I've also been participating in ongoing UTAS working groups, including **Academic System Reform**, **SSAF allocation**, and the "**This is Me**" **Inclusion Strategy**, where we continue to advocate for equity considerations to be embedded in decision-making.





Engaging with Students

I've been out and about at the **Sandy Bay Student Hub** and **Vent Tent events** on both Sandy Bay and the Medical Sciences Precinct. These pop-ups are a great way for us to hear directly from you – the students – about what's working, what's not, and what support you need.

Strategic Planning for the Year Ahead

From March 25–27, the TUSA State Council and staff came together for our **Strategic Planning Retreat**. This was a valuable opportunity to refine our goals for 2025 and ensure student equity remains at the heart of TUSA's direction moving forward.

Solution Supports for Carers

I met with Care2Serve to begin planning a dedicated peer support group for students who are also carers. This is a growing area of need, and we're excited to be taking early steps to build stronger networks for this community.

■ Workshops & Learning

We've continued to build our leadership skills through the "Leading with Influence" workshop series, and contributed to conversations on how TUSA can better support students via initiatives like the Reconciliation Action Plan Workshop and the Disability Learning Access Plan review.

Even though it's been a packed schedule, I remain committed to showing up, listening, and taking action. Your lived experiences shape our advocacy, so thank you to everyone who's spoken with us at a Vent Tent, filled out a survey, or reached out for a chat.
