Hello all, I've been focused on making practical changes that genuinely improve day-to-day student life. One of the key wins has been advocating to convert selected parking from residential to student permits, helping ease the constant pressure many of you face just trying to get to class on time or looking for a free place to park near the uni or sandy bay accommodation.

I've also been actively using our social media channels to highlight the free bus services available to students living in Sandy Bay, because transport costs shouldn't be a barrier to getting to campus or feeling connected to university life.
