I attended a Gender-Based Violence meeting with Southern Campus President, Ollie. It's been encouraging to see that student representative input is actively being sought and taken seriously in these discussions.

On Saturday the 11th, I was lucky enough to join the Unique Tassie Experiences (UTE) trip, as a guide alongside Tour Leader, Praveen. I also chaired the second Clubs & Societies meeting for the year. This was a good opportunity to check in with club representatives and run through important updates, including upcoming grant deadlines and general expectations moving forward.

On Wednesday the 22nd, we hosted a "build your own burrito bowl" lunch in the Cottage for Speech Pathology and Physiotherapy students attending resi school. We fed about 40 - 45 students, it was great to see students engaging.

On Thursday 23rd, WIN News visited the TUSA office and interviewed Maddie (our FoodHub Administrator at Inveresk) and myself about FoodHub. We spoke about the ongoing support from OzHarvest and the wider community, and how those contributions are making a real difference for students. We were then on the nightly bulletin, which my Mum was proud about.

I also sat on the interview panel for the Women's Equity Officer position. Candidates brought strong ideas and perspectives, which made for a positive but tough selection process.

Aaaaand during this month I have also spent some time speaking with Architecture students from Darchside and had informal catch-ups with campus security at Inveresk to maintain those working relationships.
